Bolf Maintenance News

We have had an excellent growing season up through around the first week of July when things started to dry out. The golf course has held up well through the dry spell we have faced with only the normal mounds and tree lines drying out. I often get the question "why don't you just run more irrigation?" When dealing with a drought situation, the simple answer is; we do. We really focus our water usage on localized areas that are prone to drying out instead of treating the entire property the same. This method conserves water greatly and could be compared to hand watering a small area for 5 minutes instead of turning on the irrigation for 20 minutes to get the same affect. Our greens are our main priority so as drought conditions persist it is not uncommon to stop watering the driving range, fairways and tees in that order to ensure we have enough to keep our greens alive. Our ponds can and have been pulled dry in the past and we would not like to re-live that scenario. We do have a deep well installed to help fill the irrigation pond in such an event. Even with the extra water usage irrigation water does not take the place of natural rainfall. Plants never respond as well to irrigation compared to rainfall. Fortunately, we have received some rainfall to relieve some of the pressure.

The Greens aeration process went perfect again this year. Not only did our equipment work well, but the temperatures were reasonable cool as compared to years past. My staff did a great job pulling together and working extended hours for several days in order to re-open for play as soon as possible. I am very thankful for the efforts and for everyones understanding of this vital process. I have been very happy with the healing process and I feel we should be healed within the three week time frame I projected if not before.
