

Golf Maintenance News

I have been approached by several members wanting to know more about our Encroachment and Mutation issues within our greens. I wanted to take some time and shine some light on these issues to help everyone understand what we are seeing.

Encroachment:

When I refer to the "encroachment' around our greens I am specifically talking about the grass from the collars moving into the perimeter of our greens surface. This is an issue for many courses with Bermuda grass greens because we can only combat this movement mechanically and not chemically due to both the collar and green being Bermuda grass. By mechanically, I am referring to the edging process we do bi-weekly during the growing season. Most of our encroachment occurred when we converted from the Bentgrass to Bermuda. During the grow-in period the collars were able to move into the un-established Mini Verde and slowly spread. Our collars are comprised of three different varieties fo Bermuda. All three varieties are obviously very invasive.

Mutation (Off-Type):

I must start with some background info about Mutation. Mini Verde is a hybrid Bermuda meaning it was an "off-type" or "Mutation" of another variety of Bermuda. This "off-type" showed better characteristics than the parent strand so growers basically began growing this mutated part of the plant and selling it as Mini Verde. Almost all (if not all) varieties of Bermuda now used on golf courses are essentially mutations that were renamed and grown for production. What we and many other clubs are witnessing is the Mini Verde "mutating" back to its original strand. The DNA is actually changing within the plant. This is more of a visual issue with very little, if any impact on putting quality.

Conclusion:

During my duration as Superintendent we have sod cut and removed existing encroachment with viable Mini Verde sod from our nursery green located between #8 and 9 with little success. The areas addressed were quickly inundated with the Bermuda grass from the collars. Over the years we have plugged out may mutated areas during the late winter/early spring when the spots seem to be the most visible. As of right now the putting green is the most effected green when it comes to the mid section of the green. We have not spend nearly as much time plugging this green as the others since it is not in regulation play. Our golf course has many moving parts and our greens are our top priority, but our focus gets spread over the property during different times of the year. We will continue to monitor and address these areas in order to keep our golf course in the best playing conditions.
